Kimberly Bryant, Smithsonian American Ingenuity Award Winner and tech education pioneer, will speak on "Black Girls CODE," 6:30 p.m., Wed., Feb. 24, in BCC's auditorium. Her talk is part of the "Not on the Test: The Pleasures and Uses of Mathematics" series of 2015-16 public lectures, which are jointly presented by the Mathematical Sciences Research Institute (MSRI) and Berkeley City College (BCC). They are made possible by funding from the Simons Foundation.

Ms. Bryant, founder and executive director of Black Girls CODE, has worked to empower girls of color to become innovators in STEM fields, leaders in their communities, and builders of their own futures through exposure to computer science and technology.

"What a Joy," a presentation on "Inside Out," the Oscar-nominated by Pixar story artist Valerie Lapointe, is set for Noon-1:30 p.m., Fri., Feb. 19, in Rm. 431, 4th Floor, at Berkeley City College. The lecture, sponsored by the college's Multimedia Arts Department, is free and open to the public.

Creative and dedicated Berkeley City College Multimedia Arts students also lead stopmotion animation, Claymation, and pixilation workshops at the Bay Area International Childrens' Film Festival (BAICFF) held Fri.-Sun., Jan. 29-31 at Oakland's Chabot Space and Science Center. Participants, ages 7 to 14, were tutored by their BCC workshop leaders in how to create of animated films. The popular workshops were developed by Academy Award-nominated Pixar animator Jim Capobianco, who work's closely with the college's Multimedia Arts Program.

Dr. Laura Ruberto will be part of San Francisco's Museo Italoamericano's roundtable discussion on "Italian American Cinema: From Capra to the Coppolas." The discussion is part of a month-long exhibit, lecture and discussion series. BCC students speak out on undocumented peoples' rights

"The Women's Movement: The Longest Revolution," will be presented by Dr. Ruth Rosen, activist, scholar and History Professor Emeritus at UC Davis, at 12:15 p.m., Tue., Mar. 8 in BCC's auditorium. The presentation, part of Women's History Month, is free and open to the public. Dr. Rosen is the author of the widely acclaimed, "The World Split Open: How the Women's Movement Changed America."

Activist students from BCC's Undocumented Community Resource Center (UCRC) were featured for the third time on Tue., Feb. 2, as part of "Al Dia," a program on Univision, Channel 14 (San Francisco). BCC student Erika Castaño and others spoke on undocumented peoples rights and described a workshop at BCC which focused on legal issues surrounding the recent increase in raids and deportation of undocumented peoples. Founded in Spring 2015, the center offers resources, workshops and support to undocumented peoples who attend BCC.
