Economist Richard Wolff presents "Trump and Our Economy: Talk vs. Reality," 12:15 p.m., Wed., Feb. 22, in Berkeley City College's auditorium. The event is part of the Jerry L. Adams Endowment Fund's Social Justice Lecture Series and is sponsored by BCC's Socialist Club.

Wolff will examine and discuss possible winners and losers under a Trump presidency. Topics will include inequality, wage issues, jobs and more. An American Marxist economist, Wolff is well known for his work in economic methodology and class analysis. He is recognized for the highly popular "Economic Update," a Pacifica Network Radio program which is syndicated on more than 60 radio stations. Wolff has appeared in television, radio and film, including Real Time with Bill Maher, The Young Turks, Moyers & Company, Charlie Rose, Al Jazeera America, The Big Picture with Thom Hartmann, CrossTalk, The David Pakman Show, Democracy Now!, The Empire Files, and The Real News Network (TRNN).

A Student Teach-In on Donald Trump and possible consequences of his presidency is set for 12:15-1:30 p.m., Tue., Feb. 7 thru Thur., Feb. 9, in the college's atrium. Sponsored by BCC's Sociology Club in collaboration with the Black Students Union, Floetry Club, STEM Club, Students for Socialism and Undocumented Student Resources Center, the event focuses on possible consequences of an impending Donald Trump presidency. It will provide an opportunity for students to educate their peers and take action on areas that could be affected by the new administration. These include its policies, funding and views around climate change, free speech, and immigration, to name a just few. The sessions are free and open to the public.

## BCC's accelerated math program highlighted in KALW interview

BCC's accelerated math program was featured in a January KALW radio interview with BCC student Sam Kaso. The program helped Kaso to knock off two semesters of math to complete his college requirements.

Kaso, an artist, plans to transfer to a four-year college to earn a bachelor's degree. He feared that the time he would spend learning math would delay his transfer plans. On a counselor's advice, he enrolled in BCC's pre-statistics class, a one-semester course that teaches math skills necessary for students to complete MATH 13 (statistics) and graduate. Berkeley City College has piloted six sections of the class. The push to convert all of the college's remedial math classes to accelerated ones is lead by Professor Daniel Najjar.
