CSU Transfer

Students are encouraged to pursue this certificate if they want to apply to transfer to the CSU system and want to complete and have certified the CSU General Education Breadth Requirements. They will select courses that fulfill the CSU General Education Breadth Requirements (completing at least 30 units with a "C" or better to include areas A-1, A-2, A-3, and B-3 and an overall GPA of 2.0), for a total 39 transferable semester units. Upon completion of these requirements they will file both a "Petition for a Certificate of Achievement" and a "Request for General Education Certification" with the Admissions and Records Office.
