



Meeting Our Students

AI in the Classroom


Are you using Al in your classes? As large language model (LLM) interfaces such as ChatGPT, Gemini, and Bard are growing in popularity, discussions about innovations and debates have emerged across educational systems about their integration and impact on the experiences of teaching and learning. Some of the most common topics involving Al in the educational system include adaptive learning platforms, automated grading and feedback systems, ethics of Al use, academic cheating, data privacy, algorithmic biases, Al-powered eduational games, chatbots for student support, and intelligent tutoring systems.


A recent Forbes poll of 500 educators ranging from elementary school to university were asked their

opinion of AI and how they integrate it in their teachings. Among the respondents, 60% of the educators reported that they are currently using AI in their classrooms. Other survey topics included ethics of AI, faculty concerns, cheating methods using AI, and more. Some of the main survey findings include 55% of respondents who had a favorable view of AI, and 60% said they use AI tools in their classrooms. The top 3 tools of choice were AI powered educational games, adaptive learning platforms, and automated grading and feedback systems. The top 3 drawbacks were fear of plagiarism in written works, fewer human to human connections, and data privacy and security. 30% said they feared job displacement for teachers. 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





To what extent do you think students should be educated about the ethical use of AI in their academic work?
