

Berkeley City College's Community Health Worker Apprenticeship Program was recently awarded a California Apprenticeship Initiative grant! This "earn while you learn" opportunity offers students paid, real-world experience while you complete classroom training. All at no cost!

If you're passionate about helping others and want to work in health, housing, or social services, this program is a great way to get started. You'll learn core skills in mental health first aid, develop digital skills for helping professions, and master core competencies in community health work. BCC's partnerships with local organizations, ensures students receive hands-on training and mentorship, preparing them for employment in high-impact roles in health and human services.



I didn't really have any knowledge or interest in mental health. But when the coup in Myanmar broke out, I was still in Singapore, and I wanted to learn how to help people in my country. So I started taking counseling courses and first aid mental health courses at BCC.

Everyone needs this kind of training, everyone faces struggles—not just you, but the people around you, as well. The training I have received here really helps me when my friends come to me for emotional support.



Becoming a Mental Health Ambassador has been really humbling. It's really about learning to trust and rely on your community, and to give back. It's made my stay here a lot more meaningful. We all come from such different backgrounds—a lot of us are non-traditional students. Learning about their experiences has really changed my perspective.
