Berkeley City College Recognized as a CVC Teaching College

On November 16, 2023, the California Community Colleges integrated Berkeley City College into the California Virtual Campus (CVC) Exchange as a Teaching College. The CVC Exchange is an innovative, student-centered tool that allows students currently enrolled in a California Community College to instantly enroll in online courses offered at eligible colleges via <https://cvc.edu/> without filling out a separate application. As a Teaching College, BCC will offer 11 badged courses to students across the state to fulfill their general education requirements and efficiently achieve their transfer or degree goal. It will not only boost BCC's enrollment efforts, but a study by Chaffey College (attached) showed a 12% increase in overall online completion rates, with even greater success for Black, Asian, male, and students aged 25-29. The CVC Exchange will be a valuable tool in achieving student success goals laid out in the 2023-2028 Educational Master Plan.




As mentioned previously, 11 BCC courses offered on the CVC exchange are badged for their outstanding quality. A badged course will show up at the top of the search results for a class in

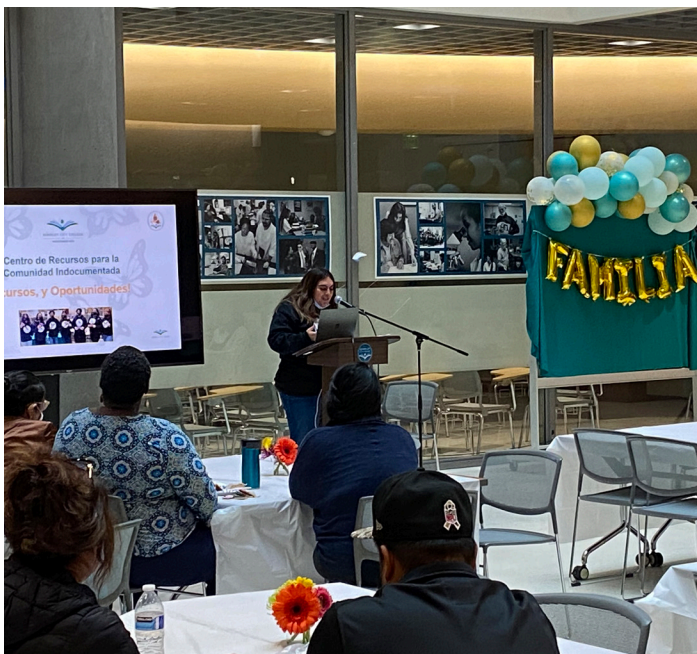


BCC Puente's Noche de Familia

Un Paso al Exito Open House



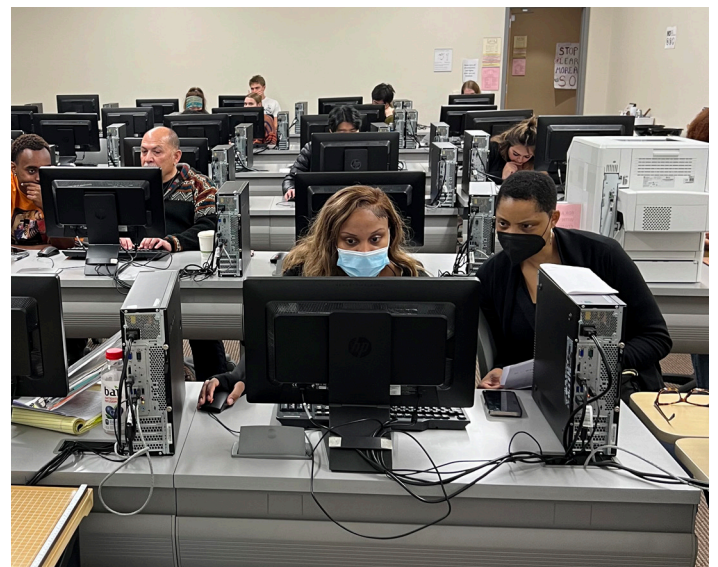

Zero and Low Textbook Cost Classes Available

As we get ready for the Spring Semester, the Affordable Educational Materials Committee would like to remind students that you can search for ZTC and LTC courses in the online schedule of classes. Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) courses are courses with free instructional materials including textbooks, workbooks, lab manuals, readers, software, and online homework systems. Low Textbook Cost (LTC) courses are those with instructional materials that cost less than \$50. You can look for the ZTC and LTC symbols in Campus Solutions next to the course, and search for them by Course Attribute > Textbook Cost Attribute.
