This year Berkeley City College has been partnering with RepresentEd Leadership, a workforce development organization connecting underrepresented students and professionals with equity-minded companies. The Level **UP Program** is part of a dynamic set of career development offerings for BCC students. Launching on July 10, Level UP participants will develop the skills and knowledge to successfully navigate the professional industries they are interested in. During the 4-week intensive, students will be exposed to a wide range of industries, alumni panels, and trainings. Each student will leave the program with a professional portfolio consisting of an updated resume, elevator pitch, LinkedIn profile, mock interview and career development plan. A total of 40 students are participating in this summer's program but RepresentEd and BCC plan to expand the program's reach by making the mock interviewsslated for August 7th – open to all interested BCC students.
