Integrated Planning Strategies

- Increase the remedial English momentum rate for African American Students to 37.2%.
- Increase the remedial math momentum for African American students to 41%.

- Increase the number of African American students who earn career-technical
- Increase the overall completion rate for African American students to 46%.
- Increase the number of transfers for Hispanic students by 100%.
- Increase the number of African American students earning degrees by 100% and education certificates by 25%
