		- Office on Instruction will not allow us to list our public
		speaking classes as asynchronous online. They have
		one or two required meeting times per semester. Merritt
		is labeling these classes as asychronous while BCC is
		calling them hybrid. Adding a new modality of fully online
		with proctored assessments would allow us to have
		consistent listings in the system and not sabotage our
		enrollment to other colleges listing them as asychronous.

b. Update on Guided Pathways (10 mins)
 Reviewed Plan of Action that was endorsed by Senate in December 2021. We did hold a Flex Day session on 3/15. Faculty participated in an activity in how our programs should be grouped. We were able to in consultation with our supporters from First Floor establish 6 pathways for the college. We have recruited 7 facilitators to suppor this process. They've been working on finalizing the names for the communities. The most popular name identified by a survey to call these pathways is "Communities." Next up will be to distribute more surveys and to hold faculty focus groups. We are planning a student town hall in Spring 22 and Fall 22. First Floor is a group that has been supporting us in our GP work (it is not BCC's first floor). We are planning a web site launch in Fall 2022. Please take the surveys that are distributed to participate in the determination of descriptors for each of the 6 ACCs (Academic & Career Communities). Can we build in questions around tutoring for the Town Hall for

c. Supporting BCC DE and CVC Efforts (10 mins)

 Home College – completed the technical steps to enable students to instantly enroll in courses at Teaching Colleges through the CVC Exchange.

	 Teaching College – completed the technical implementation that allows students from Home Colleges to instantly enroll in courses through automated cross- enrollment via CVC Exchange. Benefits of being a Teaching College: Increase student enrollment Data detailing where BCC students are taking classes and what classes they are taking. Data detailing which BCC courses are drawing students from other colleges. Roadblocks IT integration Student Services Administration Executive Administration support.
