Accreditation Update – VPI Kuni Hay (8 mins) Our VPI and ALO Kuni Hay gave a brief overview of where we have been and where we are now. We received 10 recommendations to the District and were placed on probation. We had follow up visits in October and November. We were elevated from Probation to Warning. October 1st is the deadline to submit our current followup report. We need to present at all participatory governance committees and get endorsement at the colleges before we can take it to the Board for approval. Dr. Janet Fulks and District Finance have been doing a lot of the authoring of this report. All questions shoould be sent to our ALO to communicate to the expanded Chancellor's cabinet. b. 2022 Self-Eval Survey Results (12 mins) ACCJC recommends that we evaluate our participatory governance structure and processes. One of the ways to do this is to survey committee members on their experiences over the academic year. If you have not received survey results for other committees, please email Phoumy Sayavong so you can review them. We should use the feedback for growth as the basis for determining our goals for the year. Our Senate President wants to work on expanding our faculty leadership. We have many chair positions for our committees. We need to recruit leaders, not just parrticipants. How do we do the outreach? 2022-2023 GOALS (20 mins) We shared goals from 2021: 1- Improve our Recruitment and Retention efforts to find new faculty leadership in Faculty Senate and other committee spaces. 2- Recruit student leaders to participate on our committees. They may not be listed as voting members but we can invite. 3- Improve our onboarding process for new full and part time faculty. Build an Orientation for them so they know how to engage with the college. Grant funds from EIPI could potentially help with this

		endeavor. Encourage Academic Senate as a first step to orient part time faculty to processes and engagement. Perhaps adopt the first and third goals from last year: 1) Improve our Participatory Governance processes and the evaluation of that process.
		 Update to Participatory Governance Manuel. Support Assessment Work. Advance Curriculum Committee recommendation on CIPD. Identify Student Reps to participate on Senate Standing Committees
		 3) Support Student Success. Support establishment of "Affordable Materials" committee & work. Support establishment of "Honor Council" work. Objectives could be the other suggested goals such as supporting the ASBCC, Distance Education, and Affordable Materials work.
