Update on Discipline Equivalency List (10 mins)</p> <p>Tabled; presenter not present.</p> <p>What is at stake is to speed up the process to approve/deny equivalency proposals.</p> <p>b. Meeting Modality Update (10 mins)</p> <p>The Board of Trustees voted on January 24th to return to normal operations.</p> <p>Governor Newsom ended the State of Emergency for COVID. That took effect March 1, 2023.</p> <p>Our District Academic Senate asked for legal interpretation the state's AB2449 legislation. How do we proceed with our Brown Act committees?</p> <p>The Board approved that we can provide remote options for attendance through January 2026.</p> <p>Quorum of a body (committee) is met with 50% +1.</p>

			<p>We only need quorum when we need to take action.</p> <p>Within the jurisdiction = somewhere in a Peralta building.</p> <p>If you are not within the jurisdiction, there must be "just cause" to remotely attend a meeting as a voting member.</p> <p>Just cause is defined as caregiving/childcare need, contagious illness, physical or mental disability, or travel while on office business.</p> <p>Nowhere within AB2449 is there a statement that defines what happens when just cause is not met.</p> <p>Once a member uses the "for cause" option twice in a year, additional remote appearances require committee approval.</p> <p>No member can use "just cause" for over 20% of the regular meetings in any given year.</p> <p>Senate comments: When ASL Interpretation is needed, it is most often secured when interpreter and attendee has the remote option to attend.</p> <p>Legislative (standing) committees follow Brown Act.</p> <p>Advisory Committees do not need to follow Brown Act.</p> <p>We should take action on this topic. "Looking the other way" doesn't work for everyone; some faculty will feel that their leadership is unwanted by this.</p>
