Assessment Committee Update (5 mins)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Round 5 of SLO assessments will end Spring 2024. All courses, programs, and services areas should complete their assessment in this 3-year cycle.</li> <li>- Assessment Round cycles coincide with the 3-year Program Review Cycle.</li> <li>- Completing all assessments really prepares Department Chairs and Area leads to complete the Comprehensive Program Review for their Department/Area this Fall.</li> <li>- Round 6 begins Fall 2024. All courses, programs, and services will begin a new cycle of assessment.</li> </ul> <p>If your department or area is very behind in Round 5 assessments, please make every effort to assess the most highly impacted as well as the important required courses in your programs.</p> <p>We had a decent turnout of submissions to the college's Institutional Learning Outcomes Survey, but we welcome more input, especially from Student Services and Administrative Services. Our ILO Review and Update is a college-wide effort which really involves everyone. This survey will provide us with data to inform our updates.</p>

The total number of student assessments was 398.</p> <p>While we are happy with the courses included in the assessment, we noted an inadequate sample size.</p> <p>With a population of 6687 students, we need a sample size of at least 1700 students in order to be 95% confident that the results we get will only have a <math>\pm 2\%</math> margin of error.</p> <p>With only 398 student submissions, our margin of error increases to <math>\pm 4.75\%</math>.</p> <p>For the Calculation category, 68% of all students met or exceeded standards in the category.</p> <p>Success criteria for the ILO is: 70% of the students will meet or exceed standards.</p> <p>With a large margin of error, we have to consider that Calculation results can be anywhere between 63% (approaching standards) and 73% (meeting standards). It is hard to be sure.</p> <p>Bottom line: We, as a college, need more participation in ILO assessments. We ought to identify specific courses that should participate in each ILO assessment and ensure they do.</p>
