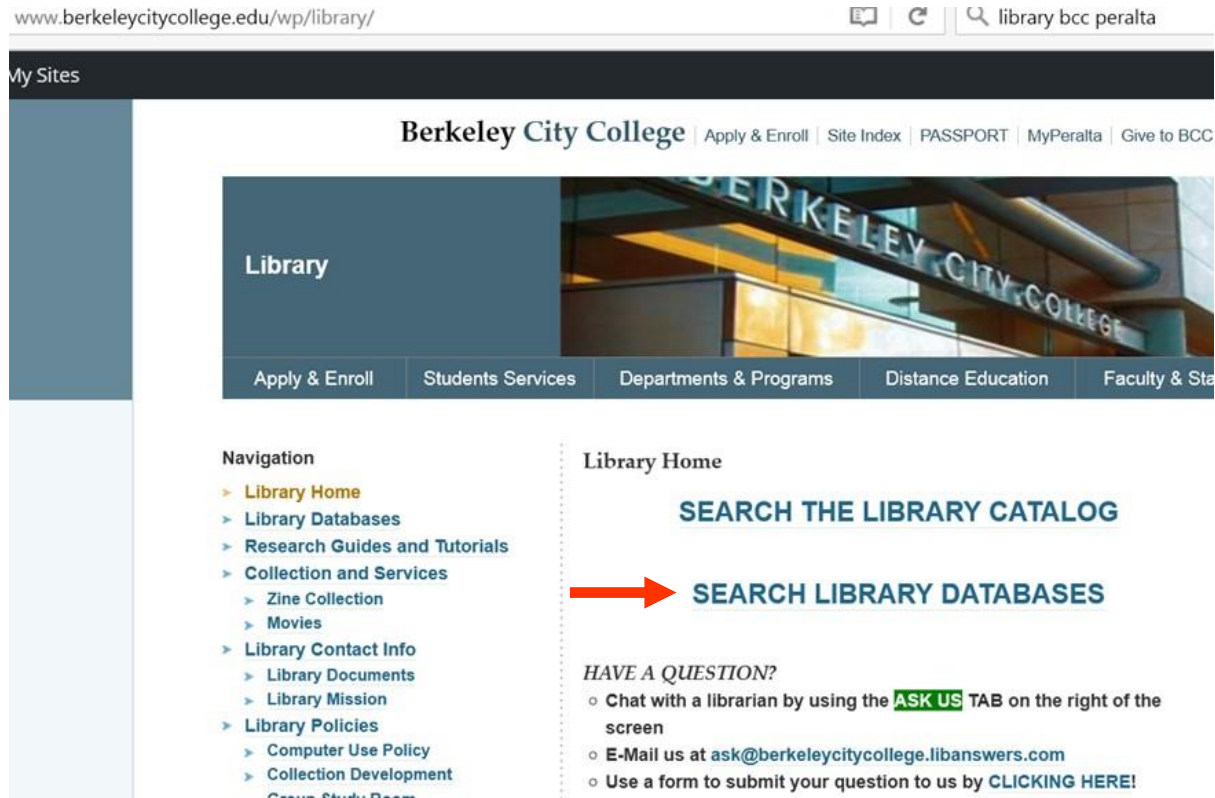


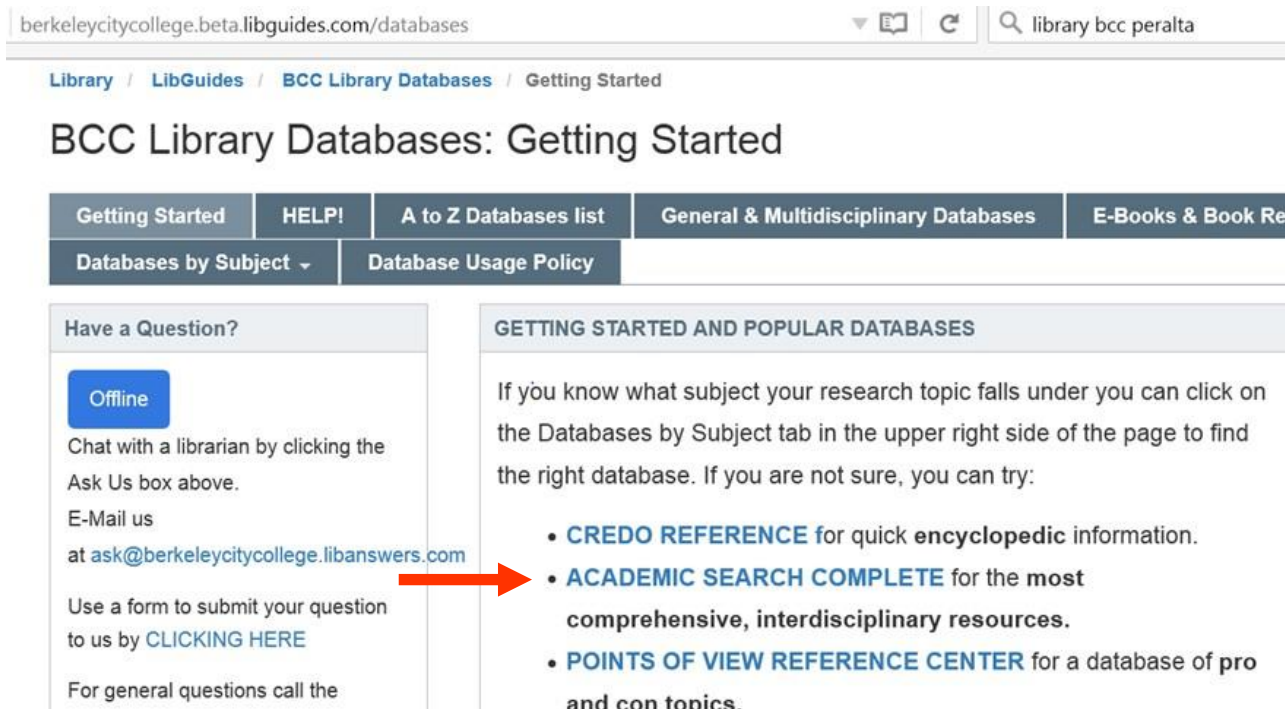
How to Select & Save a Research Article/Study in EbscoHost:
