II.	AANAPISI Presentation	Walked us through the Cooperative AANAPISI grant with Laney and BCC. Dept. of Ed. Cooperative Grant AAPI Healthy Transitions (BCC & Laney). We are an Asian American Native American Pacific Islander Serving Institution; Title III Part A-Cooperative Grant. To be recognized as AANNAPISI we need to meet a certain enrollment threshold of 20% student demographics that identifies as AAPI, we are currently at 21% and growing. This is a 25 million Grant. Reviewed the AANAPISI Project Overview with 2 Gaps. Recent Activities collaborated with Laney; Lunar New Year Celebration, Oakland Lunar New Year, First Peralta AAPA Healing Circles, Recruiting for the AANAPISI Director position, BCC AAPI Healthy Transitions Advisory Committee, Adult Ed and ESOL Design, and Support Guided Pathways Design and Planning activities. 	update	to request Pass/No Pass option. Students can request Pass/No Pass until May 27 th the last day of Instruction. The BCC and District websites are updated as well as the District Admissions website. Students must select that option to receive a Pass/No Pass grade to receive that grade; only the student can request this, the instructor cannot do this for the student. Pass/No Pass does not affect the GPA. Susan mentioned that we should advocate to the instructors that if a student is failing with an F grade, instructors encourage students to select the No Pass grade option.		
		What's the unit maximum for Pass/No Pass? (UC) system, a maximum of 14 units may be taken P/NP toward the 60 UC transferable units required to transfer as a junior. For the California State University (CSU) system and the Independent Colleges & Universities, the policies vary from campus to campus.
